Pupils rise to the challenge to achieve national success

At the beginning of the academic year all KS3 at The Telford Park School and The Telford Langley School were set an aspirational Master School and Master Class challenge to achieve a prestigious national award from Renaissance based on their collective performance in the Accelerated Reader programme.

In the 2017-18 academic year, only four secondary schools out of 5,500 in Great Britain achieved Master School status and The Telford Park School and The Telford Langley School were two of them, therefore the challenge for this year's KS3 cohort to maintain the standard set last year was great.

The qualifying criteria is exceptionally challenging and students must perform as a team and individually to be successful.

To receive this award each student in KS3 was required to achieve the following school wide targets over a 25-week rolling period:

 Minimum of 25 minutes engaged daily reading time.

Maintain a minimum average percentage accuracy when quizzing of 85 per cent.

Above 80 per cent of the school had to maintain above 85 per cent

These awards place both schools in the top performing one per cent of schools participating in the Accelerat Reader programme and solidifies The Telford Park School's position as The Top Performing Secondary School in England 2017-2018.
