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Performing Arts

Year 10 Performing Arts Trip

Year 10 Performing Arts students participated in a trip this half term to Theatre Severn in Shrewsbury to watch *Teechers* by John Godber. The students have been congratulated on their impeccable behaviour throughout the trip as they showed great respect for theatre staff, actors and other audience members, especially members of the public. They conducted themselves brilliantly, a real credit to Telford Park School. One highlight from a student as we walked into the theatre, "This is a bit posh isn't it; are you sure we're meant to be in here?". Other students are quoted saying "It was fantastic", and "I didn't think I was going to like it but I really enjoyed it". The performance featured 3 year 11 students recounting their time at Whitewall School, considering the impact their teachers had on them as they believed in them and encouraged them to be aspirational and follow their dreams, whilst also remembering funny stories from their time there. Three talented actors from the Blackeyed Theatre company faultlessly executed this performance, engaging our students from the beginning when they came to talk to the audience prior to the start of the show. The trip was designed to introduce students to the techniques used in Brechtian theatre and for them to experience a live performance in preparation for components 2 and 3 of the BTEC Performing Arts course which they will begin working on after half term.

We followed up our trip with a valuable and important evaluation and feedback session where students were keen to share their opinions of the play. The eager eyes of some students even spotted things that Mrs Bradburn didn't! Students were able to use specific vocabulary when talking about what they had seen and make evaluative judgements about artistic and creative decisions made by the director and actors. Full of aspiration and enthusiasm and a fresh passion for drama, students then immersed themselves fervently in a one and a half hour practical workshop where they explored multi-rolling and developed their skills of characterisation as they improvised and devised hilarious scenes based on characters from the play. Changes of voice, body language, movement and mannerisms were all evident in students' work. Well done Year 10.

Monday 13th March saw the start of Telford Park School's Science week for KS3 pupils. The theme this year was 'connections' and pupils were involved with a number of activities including building a glider, making spaghetti towers and discussing sustainability goals.









Also, in March a group of Year 8 pupils participated in a workshop in school lead by RICOH which explored renewable energy resources. Pupils had to work in teams to build their own water wheels using paper cups, plates, and wooden spoons.







During this half term Year 7 & 8 have been learning about DNA and inheritance. As part of this topic pupils have been making DNA out of sweets. Year 7 set 6 also made genetic bracelets to show variation (differences) in a species (humans) using different coloured beads to represent different inherited characteristics including hair colour, eye colour and if they could roll their tongues.






YEAR 9 ENGLISH DEPARTMENT CHARITY WORK
