#### Message From The Headteacher

We have had a great start to this academic year in PE with some fantastic performances. A polite reminder that all pupils are expected to wear Telford Park PE kit or plain black clothing (not branded and Hoodies are not allowed) for their PE lessons. If a pupils is unable to take part in PE they are still expected to get changed and take part in a non-participant role. If a pupil does not bring kit and refuses to wear spare, they will be issued with a detention. If a pupil also refuses to take part in a non-participant role, this will result in a C3. Government guidelines state pupils should complete a minimum of 2 hours of PE and we need to ensure we are meeting these guidelines. Your cooperation on this would be greatly appreciated.



## Food

Well we have certainly hit the ground running this half term. Our students have settled into food so well, a special shout out to my year 10 GCSE group who have already shown so much progress in practical lessons, Congratulations.

Our year 7 students have been learning about food hygiene and safety, an essential skill when working within the food room. Once this knowledge was secured, we moved onto healthy eating which saw the students practising their knife skills by chopping up some beautifully coloured fruit to make healthy fruity skewers.




Our year 8 students have been exploring healthy eating by taking part in a taste testing practical, they had to sample lots of different vegetables to see if a cooking method can change the taste, texture, appearance, and nutritional content of the food. They compared mash potato to roasted potato, boiled carrots to roasted carrot, fried corn to boiled corn and lots more. The students loved it!

We have also made a delicious stir fry.

In year 9 our students have been learning about micro-organisms and how they spoil our food. Practically we have been learning about how to feed ourselves on a budget and therefore made a delicious omelette.



In year 10 we have started the curriculum off with the macronutrients, whereby students have been learning about proteins, fats, and carbohydrates. One of our lessons included a carbohydrate investigation which involved the students comparing the calories, sugar, and fibre content of a variety of food products. The students concluded that wholemeal foods were lower in sugar and higher in fibre making them healthier. We have incorporated many practicals alongside the theory including spaghetti bolognese, fruit pie, pizza and wedges and sticky toffee pudding.





### Food (Continued)

Our BTEC students have been learning about food safety, hygiene and nutrition during their lessons. I must say I am so impressed with this class, the students have quickly applied their knowledge to the practical tasks. We have made variety of dishes including a full English breakfast and healthy salads.



Year 11 are busy completing their NEA 1 investigation coursework. For this coursework they have to carry out research around the task title and devise their own hypothesis. Once a focus for the coursework has been established they have to carry out experiments to investigate their prediction.


### Maths Update
