Dear Parents and Carers,

We are currently reviewing our school uniform policy with a view to introducing some changes for our rising Year 7 cohort in September. At this stage, we would like to share our intentions and reassure you of our commitment to supporting families throughout this process.

The proposed changes aim to ensure that our uniform is:

- **More affordable** for parents and carers,
- **More comfortable** for students, particularly those with special educational needs or disabilities (SEND),
- **Better aligned** with real-world and workplace expectations, and
- **Less likely** to result in behaviour consequences for students.

If confirmed, this new uniform would be **compulsory for students joining Year 7** in the new academic year. However, for all **existing students**, the current uniform would remain **entirely optional**, meaning there would be **no requirement to purchase new items** unless you choose to do so.

We are still in the process of finalising whether these changes are viable, and further details – including specific uniform items and suppliers – will be communicated shortly.

As we approach the end of the academic year, we would like to share our plans for the final week of term.

- On **Thursday 17th July**, students will finish school slightly earlier, at **2:10pm**.
- On **Friday 18th July**, the last day of term, students will finish at **1:00pm**.

These adjusted finish times will allow staff to prepare for the new academic year and ensure a smooth transition into September.

Week 1 of our new timetable model has been a fantastic success. Staff and students have adapted quickly and positively, and it's been brilliant to see the calm, purposeful atmosphere across the school. Lessons are running smoothly, transitions are more efficient, and the structure of the day is clearly supporting both learning and wellbeing.
